<p>19/118</p>	<p>Public Participation.</p>	<p>The Chair asked the parishioners present if they wished to make any contributions relating to any items on the agenda, or any other parish related matter which they may wish to raise.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A parishioner having sent the Parish Council their objections to Planning application no 19/2065, wished to talk more about the issues that they were concerned with, such as proximity to, and impact of the new development on their own property and concerns about the over development of the site. 2. A parishioner sent an Email to the Parish Council about their concerns about replacing the out of use footway Light near their property. The parishioner explained that recently, a yellow marker appeared on the B6413 immediately next to their boundary, south wall. It is painted on the ground adjacent to the telegraph pole, next to their yard driveway entrance, and were keen to know the reason for this new mark on the footway. They spoke with Energy North West (ENW) and contacted Amanda Ward, Assistant Property and Contracts Officer, at Eden District Council. They understand from these exchanges that a new footway light position is being considered by the Parish Council next to their yard driveway entrance. It is a 'replacement' for the light presently on the telegraph pole - which has not worked for some years. They would be very keen to work with the Parish Council on the position any new lights near their boundaries. Based on their present understanding from the emails and the conversations on site with Amanda & ENW - they would like to make the following representations to Parish Council. As the existing lights on their frontages mean they are already somewhat over-lit and more lights on more street furniture could be to the detriment of their quiet enjoyment of a rural village location. So, would like to ask that the Parish Council consider that a new lamp post is not erected adjacent to their driveway - to replace a light that's not worked for some years. There is an existing LED lamp on the corner of the B6413 and Fiddlers Lane - only a very short distance away, so they would like to ask the Parish Council to consider dispensing with the replacement altogether. Alternatives could be sited on the existing street furniture pole of the road sign that makes eastbound drivers aware of the School. (EDC is looking at this) or to put a light on the footway further up on the B6143, nearer to the School. 3. Councillor Tim Wright has proposed that the parish hold their own VE Celebrations next year to celebrate 75 years since the end of the 2nd World War in Europe. Councillor Wright will be asking for members of the community to join a steering group, and he will also get in contact with local community groups and organisations to see if they wish to get involved. 4. Parishioners have expressed their concerns regarding the closure of the public footpath near at the Lilacs due to the new development being built because the footpath has been closed for over 6 months and the date for it to be reopened by is 30th June 2019 when the closure order ends.

19/119	Report from the local Community Police.	<p>The Council received a written report from Policeman, Mark Robson, PCSO 5398. The report was as follows:</p> <p><i>“One main issue that has cropped up is that damage has been occurring to the swimming pool changing rooms and campsite (faeces in the changing rooms being found and eggs been thrown at campers tents) believed to be happening in the early hours of the morning. I am currently working with the committee to solve the issues here. At this time I do not have any suspects but would be obliged if anyone has any info to help to contact myself. The swimming pool is considering CCTV. The pool committee have been encouraged to report all incidents to myself, to build an intel picture.”</i></p> <p>The Council received the following notification from Cumbria Police and Cumbria’s Police and Crime Commissioner’s office:</p> <p><i>“...We continually look at ways we keep you informed and updated about news in our local communities, using new technology and channels. 	a. Transfer of Assets and Service to the Parish (last minute no. 19/94).	<p>The Council received an update regarding the 'Transfer of Assets and Services' to the Parish'. As explained at Agenda item 6, Minute no.19/118 of these Minutes, a parishioner expressed concerns about the number of footway lights surrounding his property and the effect they had on his enjoyment of it. Therefore they have asked the Parish Council if they would consider either re-siting it or not having it re-connected. The Parish Council discussed the financial implications; the possible impact on other properties if the light was re-sited. The Parish Council also pointed out that the locations of the footway lighting had been decided on a long time ago, including all progress being recorded in the Parish Council Minutes and reproduced in the Parish Councils Newsletter on a regular basis, so knowledge on the siting of these lights had been advertised for a few years.</p> <p>RESOLVED that it was agreed that Councillors John Judson, Tim Wright and Peter Foley would have an onsite meeting with the parishioner and report back to the July 2019 meeting of the Parish Council.</p>
	b. Public Participation - Algae at Will Pool (last minute no. 19/90).	<p>The Council received an update about the algae at Will Pool. As agreed at the May 2019 Meeting of the Parish Council, the Clerk rang the Environmental Agency today to report the algae in Will Pool, in case it is the more poisonous Blue Green algae. They sent someone out to test the water. If it was blue-green algae then the Environment Agency will ask the Parish Council to put warning signs up. Thankfully, it tested negative for blue-green algae, and the algae were just the normal type. Councillor Chris West also asked Eden River Trust about the algae too and they suggested straw as it creates gasses that keep algae at bay. A straw bale has now been put in the pond.</p> <p>Councillors John Judson with the help of a parishioner has also made a few</p>

	repairs at Will Pool.
	<p>RESOLVED that the report about the algae at Will Pool be noted.</p> <p>ALSO RESOLVED that it be noted that the Parish Council wish to thank Councillor John Judson and the local parishioner for giving their time to do the repairs at Will Pool.</p>
c. Public Participation – Overnight Campers at Eden Bridge Car-park (last minute no. 19/90).	<p>The Council received an update regarding overnight campers at Eden Bridge Car-park. The volunteers who keep the recycling centre clean have said that they have seen the occasional overnight camper-van at the bridge car-park. However, they don't recognise any litter or fly-tip that may have been left by over-nighters. Probably because most campervanners do not like to leave anything behind. Litter at the car-park is usually the odd newspaper, takeaway wrappers, bottle-tops, and cigarette ends, which they guess are left by people having a bit of 'leisure' there. Apparently, the volunteers as regular campervanners themselves said that in Germany and France many places like the bridge have been 'developed' a little; some with unmanned coin/payment electric hook-up points and safe toilet disposal points. There are directories in those countries detailing where these places are and what facilities they offer. They generate a bit of income for the community that provides them and serve to manage the activity in some way, although they probably have to avoid being in competition with local camp-sites.</p>
	RESOLVED that no further action be taken other than to continue to monitor the situation of overnight camping at Eden Bridge car park.
d. Report from the local Community Police (last minute no. 19/92).	<p>The Council received an update regarding catching persistent speeders in the village. Mark Robson - PCSO 5398 has spoken to PC Norman Black in relation to the question that he had at the May 2019 Parish Council meeting - would a Police Officer be able to attend the village to catch persistent speeders. Mark has said that PC Black is aware and is going to take a look at the speed watch spreadsheet. He is happy to pop out himself and catch the speeders and he will pass on to the proactive team for further cover.</p>

Eden District Council is holding a free self-build and community-led housing event, at Rheged, near Penrith on 4th July 2019, for anyone interested in building their own home in Eden. 19/123	Report from County Councillor Hilary Carrick.	<p>The Council received a written report from County Councillor Hilary Carrick about County Council related matters affecting the Parish.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Flooding on the B6413 – County Councillor Hilary Carrick has reported the fact that the B6413, just above Will Pool, floods regularly during periods of heavy rainfall to the County Council’s Highways team. Councillor Carrick has indicated that the Parish Council believe this may be due to the fact that the drains that go under the road in that area may be blocked and have asked them to investigate the issue and advise what remedial action will be taken. 2. Blocked drain - On behalf of a resident, County Councillor Carrick has reported a blocked drain outside Rigg House and this has been added to the list to be cleared. 3. Traffic Issues Working Group - The Group met on Wednesday 29 May to discuss developments since the last meeting. The traffic/speed counters will be installed this week at the agreed five locations: near the school, bowling club, Village Hall, top of the hill and near Thorn Lea. Councillor Carrick has been advised that it has not been possible to install these earlier due to local road works and latterly the school holidays last week. A small number of traffic management solutions have been considered, to try to address traffic flow issues through the village. These are being investigated further by the Highways team and the outcome will be reported back. <p>RESOLVED that County Councillor Hilary Carrick be thanked for her report, the contents of which were noted.</p>

19/130	Registering Lazonby & District Swimming Pool and Community Playground as Assets of Community Value.	<p>The Council considered the nominations for registering Lazonby & District Swimming Pool and Community Playground as Community Assets. Nominations for the listing of Lazonby & District Swimming Pool and Lazonby Community Playground as Assets of Community Value on Eden District Council’s Asset Register have now been withdrawn from the process of registering after representatives for the Lazonby & District Swimming pool have expressed concerns. They have asked that no action is taken that may contravene the terms of its lease from the Diocesan Board; and have concerns about the implications and ramifications of the formal Listing of their property on their ability to continue to operate these community facilities, to carry out future repairs, maintenance and improvements, and their ability to secure future external funding. As well as concerns that the listing of this property may bring with it additional restrictions and restraints which would make the continued operation of these community facilities more difficult and more costly. A lease has been granted to the Association by the Diocesan Board over the land on which the Swimming Pool is built which is not due to expire until 31st December 2045, also the Pool’s Management Committee has been running the facility for well over 50 years, and there is no reason to believe that circumstances will be changing in the foreseeable future. The Diocesan Board have no intention of selling the land that they own (the Swimming Pool land), and the Swimming Pool Association have no intention of selling the land that they own (the playground and campsite land). They believe there is no point in going into any matters affecting legal title if there is no intention on the part of either party to sell their freehold interests. In the view of the Diocesan Board and the Swimming Pool Association, none of these community assets are under threat in any way. They believe these valuable community assets will continue to thrive without this nomination as ‘Assets of Community Value’ intervention.</p> <p>However, Will Pool, the Parish Sports Playing Field and Coronation Gardens are still being nominated as Assets of Community Value.</p> <p>RESOLVED that the Parish Council agreed that there was no advantage in nominating the Swimming pool, or the Community Playground, as an Assets of Community Value.</p> <p>ALSO RESOLVED that the Clerk inform the representative of the Swimming Pool and the Community Playground and Eden District Council of the Council’s decision not to proceed with the Nominations as Assets of Community Value.</p>
