RESOLVED that it be noted that the Clerk had advised the parishioner to fill in the Parish Councillor application form and submit it to the Council if they wished to join the Council.

The Council received a report about the Parish Council's involvement in helping the local community during the Coronavirus Covid19 pandemic and other relevant information. Councillor Chris West reported that local community volunteers are still helping people in the parish with lifts to get the vaccine, delivering shopping and prescriptions. However, fewer people are no asking for help.

These are as follows:</p> <p>1. Planning Application No. 21/0141 – Erection of a timber granny annexe, at Coombe Eden. Armathwaite, Carlisle.</p> <p>RESOLVED that Planning Application No. 21/0141 – Erection of a timber granny annexe, at Coombe Eden. Armathwaite, Carlisle be considered further at agenda item 17, which is item 21/51 - Planning Applications – New (or Appeal) of these Minutes.</p>
21/41	Public Participation.	<p>The Chair asked the parishioners present if they wished to make any contributions relating to any items on the agenda, or any other parish related matter which they may wish to raise. The Parish Council also discussed issues that parishioners had been in contact about.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A parishioner has expressed their concerns about the fish and chips van using Eden Bridge car park. They are concerned about the number of cars parked both sides of the road and on a blind corner, and believes it is an accident waiting to happen. They have said that it is a struggle to drive though it all as the cars that are parked up have their head lights and hazards on which is blinding at night. People are also walking in the middle of the road to get their food with no lights or reflective gear. The parishioner understand there's nothing the Council can do about that but suggested moving the fish and chips van to Lazonby auction mart instead, as there was adequate safe parking. The Council discussed this so that an answer could be given to the parishioner. 2. A parishioner has expressed their concerns about the state of Footpath number 339023 that runs from The Meadows to its junction with Scaur Lane. They explained that it is a useful short cut to the village centre and used more since the development of the houses. The footpath runs alongside Harrowbeck which frequently floods onto the path making it very muddy and uneven. The parishioner has said that this could be easily improved by dredging the bed of the beck which is silted up and removing the large stones that are deposited in it, possibly from the building work. They have asked if the Parish Council could finance the hire of a small digger to rectify this situation, with the necessary work being done by volunteers or in cooperation with the relevant Council department. Councillor Chris West and a parishioner have already investigated the situation with the footpath and the beck. A local contractor has said that they could do the work for £250 with help from volunteers and using a small digger on a rubber track. The land is owned by the Carlisle family who are happy for the work to be carried out. It has also been reported that another contractor is going to carry out some work on the beck too which need to be looked into. The Parish Council discussed what could be done to improve the footpath. 3. Another parishioner has expressed concerns about the barbed wire fence along footpath 339021 by the river Eden.

		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. A parishioner has provided photographs of footpath 339021 by the river Eden, one which was taken 10 years ago and one that was taken recently which shows the extensive erosion of the river bank and the loss of the original footpath. 5. A parishioner has asked questions about the B4RN Broadband project after receiving the leaflet about it. These questions were forwarded to B4RN to reply as some were technical. 6. A parishioner has expressed concerns about the trees obscuring the school sign at the bottom of Townfoot. Cumbria Highways has been informed but nothing has been done as yet. 7. A parishioner has reported that there is a dropped flag stone on the pavement near the Midland Hotel near the railway bridge which could be a tripping hazard.
		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. RESOLVED that the Clerk write to the parishioner regarding their concerns about the Fish & Chip van at Eden Bridge car park to inform them that the Parish Council have considered and noted their concerns about the traffic issues at Eden Bridge car park; and to tell them that the Fish and Chip vans have a license issued by Eden District Council to allow them to trade during the pandemic which says they must abide by the Covid rules of social distancing etc. so Parish Council cannot stop traders with licenses to trade coming to the Parish; furthermore that Eden Bridge car park has been an established site for selling Fish and Chips for many years prior to the pandemic. 2. ALSO RESOLVED that it be noted that a Member of the Parish Council will post on a local parishioners group on social media to remind patrons of the rules, and to ask that they wear high viz if possible and to be careful how they use the car park during the time they buy their fish and chips. 3. RESOLVED that Councillor Chris West will continue to investigate into the clearing of Harrowbeck to improve the issue of flooding onto the footpath. 4. RESOLVED that it be noted that the Clerk has written to the parishioner regarding their concerns about the barbed wire fence along footpath 339021 by the river Eden, to inform them of the Council's response after their discussion about this matter at their February 2021 Meeting. 5. h. Donations at Eden Bridge Car Park (Last minute no. 21/21).	The Council received an update about the donation giving possibilities at Eden Bridge car park. Councillor Steve Craig has been looking into the possibility of paying donations via the internet using an app or website on behalf of the Council. He has been in touch with the UK Online Giving Foundation to ask how the Council could use their services to receive donations for the upkeep of Eden Bridge car park. The service allows the Council to set a donation amount. The donation can be text to a special code/number for the Parish Council. They will pay the donations received to the Council on a 3 monthly basis or when it reaches £100. The provider will take 5% of the donation for their fee. The donation information can be put on a sign at Eden Bridge car park, and advertised on the Parish Council website and other relevant places. The account can be used for general fundraising or even for the fishing permits. There could also be the possibility of using a QR code too.
	RESOLVED that Councillor Steve Craig will further investigate how to collect donations at Eden Bridge Car Park and report back to the next meeting of the Parish Council.
i. Charge Points for electric cars in Cumbria (Last minute no. 21/21).	The Council received an update about the charge points for electric cars in Cumbria. The Council discussed the possibility of the new housing development putting charge points in, or the land that would be needed if not, access to Wifi, the possible costs to the Parish Council and if it should be something the Parish Council provides in the first place.
	RESOLVED that Councillor Tim Wright will investigate the options about charge points more and speak to Dalston Parish Council about their car charging points.
j. Safety sign on the Lane near Croglin Toys (Last minute no. 21/17).	RESOLVED that following advice from Cumbria County Council regarding putting a safety sign on the lane near Croglin Toys and possible liability if they do, that the Parish Council agreed that they could go no further with this.

The door has been looked at and needs a lot of work done to it. Councillor John Judson has received an initial quote to find out much it would cost to repair which was over £2000. Proposed Development of Lazonby Egg Packing Station.	<p>Councillor Gordon Nicolson gave the Members an update on progress with the proposed development of the former Egg Packing Station for affordable housing. Since putting the project on hold due to losing the original partner in the project, Councillors Gordon Nicolson, Chris West and Peter Foley have had two meetings with Eden District Council regarding several issues that need to be dealt with, and one meeting with a potential new partner who is interested in taking the project forward but will remain confidential until the agreement has been finalised. The new development could also be an opportunity to have electric charge points as discussed previously in the meeting.</p> <p>RESOLVED that the report about the proposed development of the former Egg Packing Station for affordable housing be noted with thanks to Councillors Gordon Nicolson, Chris West and Peter Foley.</p>
	b. Traffic Issues Consultation.	<p>The Council received an update on the Traffic issues in the parish.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. After the traffic orders for yellow lines was discussed by the Traffic Issues Steering Group, publically consulted on, and then the areas to be done agreed on, the proposed yellow lines for the village will be put in over the next month. 2. With the increase of traffic from the new housing development there will be an increase in the volume of gritted areas this includes Plumpton and the road to Great Salkeld. The criteria for gritting is triggered by the temperature not the volume of traffic. 3. Cumbria County Council has been consulted on the traffic from the new housing development. The public have been sent letters about it. Cumbria Highways decision will be final. The quote for the costs of building the paths is £96,000 if carried out by County Council contractors. However, because some of the land belongs to Cumbria Highways then any other contractors would have additional costs involved when doing the work. There is also part of a wall to rebuild. There will also be an additional cost of drawing up of a new plan of the land for the land owner. Councillor Carrick is to seek two further quotes for the work.</p> <p>RESOLVED that it be noted that Councillor Hilary Carrick will seek quotes for the building of the footpath between Eden Bridge and Lazonby & District swimming pool and will present them to the Parish Council.</p>
