		<p>requires advice on any item involving a possible declaration of interest which could affect his/her ability to speak and/or vote, he/she is advised to contact the clerk at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting.</p> <p><u>A note from the Clerk to the Council.</u> A personal interest might be reasonably regarded as one which might affect a member's wellbeing, financial position, or business (which would be a 'direct' interest, as it impacts on the member directly); or that of a relative or friend (which would be an 'indirect' interest) to a greater extent than that of other council tax payers, ratepayers or other inhabitants of the area. A personal interest will also be a prejudicial interest if a member of the public, who knows the relevant facts, would reasonably think that a member's personal interest is so significant that it is likely to prejudice his / her judgement of the public interest.</p>

3. **Westmorland and Furness Council update on LGR 16th November 2022** - Sam Plum and Jonathan Brook have agreed to give Parish and Town councils in Westmorland and Furness an update on LGR on 16th November 2022 at 7 pm, the meeting room will be open from 6.45 pm. The meeting will be held on Microsoft Teams.
4. **A personal Invitation to the 2022 Eden Tourism Summit - 'Sustainability and Innovation within Eden's visitor economy'** at Center Parcs, Whinfell Forest, Penrith on Wednesday 19 October 2022, 10 am to 1.30 pm (registration from 9.30 am) at a cost of £10.
5. **CALC Question and Answer session on the Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) application** - You are invited to attend a Question and Answer session on the CIO application prior to the CALC Annual General Meeting. The event will be held on the 17th of October at 7 pm as a virtual meeting. CALC is currently an unincorporated association. An unincorporated association is an organisation set up through an agreement between a group of people who come together for a reason other than to make a profit - for example, a voluntary group or a sports club. An unincorporated association is not a legal entity so cannot enter into contracts and is expected to operate with volunteers, not paid staff. Individual members of an unincorporated association are personally responsible for any debts and financial obligations. A Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) is different to an unincorporated association. It operates in the same manner as a small limited company. It is registered with the Charity Commission and adheres to charity legislation, all of which are less onerous than the requirements of Companies House. Becoming a registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation will give CALC a more robust and professional platform for the future and will demonstrate to our stakeholders that we mean business. If you would like to know more about the proposed change to CALC's legal structure ahead of the AGM, then join your fellow CALC members for this informal question and answer session. Your opportunity to more fully understand why the AGM is requested to approve a draft constitution to support a change to CALC's current

legal structure.

- 6. Invitation for Town and Parish Councils to Cumbria Flood and Coast Forum** on 20th October 2022 at Castle Green Hotel, Castle Green Lane, Kendal, Cumbria.
- 7. General Data Protects Regulations (GDPR) Training** - CALC has organised a virtual training session on GDPR, this will be held on 12th October at 7.30 pm, £25 per person.
- 8. Invitation to Scribefest 2022 on Friday, October 14th 2022** - It will be hosted live on zoom between 10 am and 3.30 pm – It's a free conference dedicated to Parish, Town, and Community councils. The event starts with a keynote by MP Duncan Baker, followed by over 10 expert speakers. Topics include Healthy Neighborhoods, Bullying and The Law, JPAG guide updates, Wellbeing, Web accessibility, Sustainability and more. There will also be prize draws and a book launch (An Improper Officer), along with celebrating all the good work the local gov sector does.
- 9. Sustainable Transport in the Lake District – Presentations and discussion on 7th October 2022, 9 am – 11 am online via Zoom.** Come and hear experts discuss some of the challenges and opportunities for sustainable travel in the Lake District, and contribute to the debate by pre-submitting questions. This event is part of the research that was detailed in the Lake District National Park Management Plan. ACTion with Communities in Cumbria is hosting this event for the Sustainable Transport and Travel Key Outcome Group. The event will inform the framing of three research priorities of the LDNPP Management Plan Outcome 5, namely:
 - How visitors and residents would like to move [to and] around the park.
 - How to address congestion and net zero with respect to transport
 - Better awareness of relevant global innovation in the transport and mobility sector, specifically in relation to behaviour change and implementation.
- 10. and in doing this, understand more clearly the appetite for change across stakeholder groups and the nature of any changes possible and needed in regard to Lake District access and transport. The experts who will present ideas and contribute to the discussion at the event are:**
 - Professor Jillian Anable, Chair of Transport and Energy, Leeds University –scenarios for future access and travel to the Lake District that takes into account current and emerging understanding of the social trends in how people travel and the imperatives and legal obligations to decarbonise travel.
 - James Berresford, Deputy Chair of the Peak District National Park – visitor economy & national parks scenarios that balance the need to widen access whilst limiting car-borne journeys, referring to studies on traffic omissions, attitudinal surveys, and plans for recreation hubs and rail and trail connectivity.
 - James Blake, CEO of the Youth Hostel Association - future scenarios of access and transport that tackle the current social exclusion linked to car dependency and cost.
 - Stephen Joseph, Transport Policy Advisor - scenarios based

		<p>on best transport practices available in the UK under existing policy frameworks, notably integrated public transport in Cornwall, moves towards traffic management and charging for car parking Snowdonia, car clubs, DRT, e-bike hire, zero carbon commuting including structured car sharing, and rural hubs. Linking to wider spatial planning and economic development policies, recognising the LDNPA transport will be influenced by activities in the areas around it like West Cumbria.</p> <p>Their Chair for the event will be Steve Curl. The event will be held on zoom. Booking will close <u>at noon on 6th October</u>. Once all the available places are taken we will hold a waiting list and may make more places available. If you would like to pose a question for the panel to consider, you can detail this in the Eventbrite registration. We plan to have two sets of panel discussions on submitted questions. Submission of questions will close <u>at 12 noon on the 3rd of October</u>.</p> <p>11. Invite to the joint EALC / EDC event – Settlement Study. Settlement studies can be used to inform decisions on the current and future roles of towns and villages and their place within an area. The purpose of this assessment is to provide an understanding of the nature, role and function of communities across Eden that sit outside the two national parks. It will identify how our settlements inter-relate to each other and will inform evidence to influence future spatial planning in our local area. Join your fellow EALC members to hear from Réa Psillidou (EDC Planning Policy Manager) and Rachael Armstrong (EDC Senior Planning Officer) about a forthcoming settlement study and more fully understand the parameters that town and parish councils will ask to be considered.
