18/111	Apologies for absence.	RESOLVED that it be noted that there were no apologies for absence.
18/112	The filling of Council Member Vacancies.	The Council considered nominations to fill the Council Member vacancy by Co-option following a recent Councillor resignation. A 'Notice of Vacancy' was issued following the resignations of Virginia Minihan and Peter Minihan. There were no nominations for election. The Council can now look to co-opt new Members, as there are currently three vacant positions for Parish Councillors. Letters have been given to 'The Meadows' residents to try and recruit Councillors to represent that area of the village.

18/116	Public Participation.	<p>The Chair asked the parishioners present if they wished to make any contributions relating to any items on the agenda, or any other parish related matter which they may wish to raise.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A parishioner having contacted the Parish Council expressed their concerns about the footpath at 'The Meadows' and asked for it to be put back on the agenda. The Parish Council explained that it had been removed as it was thought that there was nothing else the Parish Council could do about the path itself. However, as it seems there are still broader issues to deal with such as the role and responsibilities of the estate's Management Committee, plots/deeds and certain areas for adoption by Cumbria County Council, the Parish Council will put it back on the agenda under 'Boundaries at the Meadows'. The parishioner also expressed concerns about the lack of information about the land within the site which is to be adopted by Cumbria County Council and the land which will be the responsibility of the Management Company, the service charges to residents, access rights etc. 2. A parishioner expressed their concerns about the prospect of school buses stopping, picking up and dropping off in School Lane especially as it was already a congested area not suitable for this sort of traffic. County Councillor Hilary Carrick explained that the School had asked if buses could stop, pick up and drop off in School Lane. However on investigating into the possibilities of this, Cumbria Highways said that they were not in favour of School Lane being used by the bus as it is too narrow, there is no turning place and it was not suitable for buses. However, it was explained that if Cumbria Highways had been in favour of this idea then there the local Community would have been consulted before any decisions were made. The new Traffic and Road Safety Issues Consultation will also be a chance for parishioners to express their concerns. A suggestion was made to put yellow lines at Edenside to Edendale which will stop traffic flow being reduced to single width, which County Councillor Hilary Carrick will look into. 3. Parishioner has expressed concerns about the train timetable and why a later train at 8.30 pm does not stop at Lazonby, among other trains, especially as the scheduled stop would be of benefit to the local community who may wish to stay out later in Carlisle. 4. A parishioner asked if the Parish Council could gift money rather than organisations asking for a grant. The Council discussed it and did not think it was the correct way to proceed. <p>1. RESOLVED that the Parish Council agreed to write to Cumbria County Council and the Estate Management Company about the service charges and costs to the residents, and to explain that there is potential for misunderstanding over which areas of the development,</p>

		<p>including footways and play area, are accessible by right by all members of the public, and which areas are accessible only to occupiers of dwellings on the site who are paying for the maintenance, so to ask them to supply a plan and any other details showing which roads and paths on the development have been or are intended to be adopted by the County Council as maintainable at public expense, and any other details showing the ownership and access rights and public liability arrangements on the Meadows development.</p> <p>2. RESOLVED that the report about the prospect of school buses stopping, picking up and dropping off in School Lane not being pursued be noted.</p> <p>3. RESOLVED that the Council ask Northern Rail why the newly scheduled 8.30 pm train from Carlisle does not stop at Lazonby station in Cumbria, especially as this scheduled stop would be of benefit to the local community who may wish to stay out later in Carlisle.</p>
18/117	Super fast Broadband.	<p>The Council received a verbal report regarding Superfast Broadband from Broadband Hub Coordinator Brian Smythe. Brian has produced two documents based on research he has carried out on superfast broadband in the area. These documents include current broadband prices and an update on Super Fast Broadband in the Parish of Lazonby and how to access faster broadband. In Kirkoswald and Renwick 88 people have signed up for the EE service and are getting 30-50 mb. External aerials are needed on some properties too. 5G services are also now in the pipeline too.</p> <p>RESOLVED that the Council approve the two documents regarding the current broadband prices and an update on Super Fast Broadband in the Parish of Lazonby and how to access faster broadband.</p> <p>ALSO RESOLVED that these two documents about superfast broadband coverage and prices be put on the Parish Council website.</p> <p>ALSO RESOLVED that Brian Smythe be thanked for his report about Superfast Broadband, the contents of which were noted.</p>
18/118	Report from the local Community Police.	<p>The Council received a report from the local Community Police. Mark Robson, PCSO 5398 did not attend the June 2018 Parish Council meeting as he was dealing with Appleby Horse Fair. He, however, gave a written report to say that there was not much to pass on regarding his north rural patch because it has been generally trouble free. There has been the odd suspicious vehicle(s), so just a reminder to the public to keep doors and windows locked when in an unoccupied room. Please report any suspicious vehicles to 101. Also, the roads will be busy on the Alston to Penrith Road, via Langwathby.</p> <p>However, in May 2018, PCSO Mark Robson also sent an Email to Better Highways Eden, which was also copied to the Parish Council and Bells of Lazonby, explaining that he was conducting speed checks on the Junction of Seat Hill in Lazonby on 30/04/18 and whilst doing these checks, he was approached by the owner of Bells of Lazonby, who explained that he has a problem when HGVs attempting to leave the junction onto the main road. In summary, there is a large marked parking bay at the Junctions mouth. When a vehicle parks here it makes it tight for HGV's to leave the junction. The HGVs need the whole junction in order to see to the left, to get a safe view. When a car is parked in the bay the HGV is forced to squeeze past the parked car and then has to leave completely straight leaving a blind spot. It</p>

		<p>was also pointed out to me that people park on Seat Hill at the wide bend to the top of the hill and before the railway station. When cars park here HGVs have to mount the grass verge and then the pavement which in turn endangers the safety of pedestrians. Would it be possible to consider some double yellows lines on the corner? Would it be possible to look at the parking bays and consider potentially removing them? Even a mirror may assist at the junction? PCSO Robson has taken some photos, which he is happy to pass onto the right department for dealing with this. Also, another local parishioner agreed that the marked bays do cause a problem when a vehicle parks here and for the safe departure of an HGV. Although PCSO Robson did not witness any of these issues, as there were no parked cars in the bays and there weren't many cars on the junction, however, looking at it, he can see the issue, especially as a lot of people already park on Seat hill near the railway station.</p> <p>County Councillor Hilary Carrick reminded the Parish Council about the parking bay trials that were made in that area a couple of years ago. The Parish Council have two choices - have them burnt out and re-tarmaced or to let them fade away.</p> <p>RESOLVED that the Council agreed that the parking bay lines should be allowed to fade out rather than burnt out and re-tarmaced.</p> <p>ALSO RESOLVED that Mark Robson, PCSO 5398 be thanked for his report about Community Policing, the contents of which were noted.</p>

18/120	Progress Reports on Recent Actions.	<p>The Council received progress reports regarding matters from the Minutes of the 2nd May 2018.</p>
	a. Lease with Croglin Designs Ltd (Last minute no. 18/90).	<p>The Council received an update about the lease with Croglin Designs Ltd. The Clerk has been in touch with the Surveyors several times and eventually received a reply to say that they were working on the report. However, the report has still not be finished.</p> <p>RESOLVED that the Clerk contact the surveyors chosen to do the work at the Old School and give them a 7-day deadline to finish the report otherwise the Parish Council will be forced to ask someone else to do the work, and there will be no fee paid to them.</p>
	b. Transfer of Assets and Service to the Parish (Last minute no. 18/90).	<p>The Council received an update on the 'Transfer of Assets and Services'. The agreement to transfer the footway lighting has been issued for signing by Eden District Council. The Clerk has scanned and sent it around to the Parish Council Members to view prior to the June 2018 meeting of the Parish Council. The deadline for signing has now been moved to September 2018. However, the swings at Coronation Gardens have not been included in the agreement. Therefore, several issues still need to be discussed before the Parish Council sign the 'Transfer of Assets and Service' agreement regarding footway lighting and the swings, such as annual inspections, insurance, the agreement regarding the unadopted lights, the swings and grant availability. Councillors will ask for a meeting with Eden District Council. There has been no commitment yet from County Council regarding the footway lighting and future maintenance.</p>

	RESOLVED that the Councillors Gordon Nicolson, Chris West and Jeff Bellas will attend a meeting with Eden District Council.
c. General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) (last minute no. 18/90).	The Council received an update regarding General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). The GDPR Working Group met at the beginning of May where they considered the policies and documents to make the Parish Council GDPR Compliant. These have been sent out to all Parish Council Members for comments with the aim of approving them at the June 2018 meeting of the Parish Council. This will make the Parish Council GDPR Compliant. The Clerk is still, however, going through the Parish Council files and destroying or putting them in the County Council Archives. It has also been confirmed that Parish and Town Councils and Parish meetings do not need to appoint a Data Protection Officer under GDPR.

No further action has been taken and the parish notice board remains where it is. The broken perspex will be replaced in the door. Also, the varnishing of the weathered notice board at Townhead will be done soon.

Eden District Council has announced that Rose Rouse is to take up the role of Chief Executive of Eden District Council from July 2018. 2. 81 affordable houses will be built in Penrith over the next few years starting with a delivery of 13 to 15 in the first year. 3. Eden District Council's Signature Project Grant Fund is to be available from 11,000 up to 100,000. An expression of interest should be made by 1st October with decisions made by March 1st. There is a criteria to meet to receive funding - such as long-term sustainability. 25% match funding is needed. Parish Councils can be accountable bodies for this funding and it is encouraging that they look favourably at doing this. <p>RESOLVED that it be noted that District Councillor Gordon Nicolson reserved the right to request to speak on other issues on the agenda.</p> <p>ALSO RESOLVED that District Councillor Gordon Nicolson be thanked for his report, the contents of which were noted.</p>
<p>18/122</p>	<p>Report from County Councillor Hilary Carrick.</p>	<p>The Council received a written report from County Councillor Hilary Carrick about County Council matters affecting the Parish.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Traffic and Road Safety Issues Consultation, now known as the 'Traffic and Road Safety Survey', is now in its draft form ready for Parish Councillors to give their opinion. Once it has been finalised it will go on the Cumbria County Council website and a notice about it put on the Parish Council website and parish notice boards. The deadline for comments is 7th July 2018. 2. The request for school buses to park, and drop and pick up pupils in School Lane is not going to happen because Cumbria Highways is not in agreement with it and the residents are against it too. 3. There has been a notice of intended closure of the Garthfolds Farm to Main Street footpath put up at the village hall end of the footpath but not at the Scarrows road end. This has been done to allow for the new housing development to carry out work in that area. A parishioner had contacted the Parish Council about this but as it was deemed a County matter the Clerk passed it onto County Councillor Carrick. There are closure notices but only on the 80 m stretch from the village to half way up High Seat Hill. However, County Council has said they will also place a notice by the farm further up. 4. Cumbria County Council is currently reviewing third-party agreements with them due to Health & Safety reasons and the public putting themselves at risk. Once completed it will be clearer regarding where
