<b>23/26</b>	<b>Apologies for absence.</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that the apologies received from Parish Councillor Angie Miller, Peter Foley, Phillip Whitehead and Tim Wright be accepted and noted.
<b>23/27</b>	<b>The filling of a Council Member Vacancy.</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that the Council have not received any nominations as yet to co-opt new Council Members and now it is near to the local elections in May 2023, then any prospective candidate should be encouraged to fill in an Elections nomination form.

<b>23/30</b>	<b>Matters of Urgency.</b>	The Council received the following matters which arrived too late to be otherwise placed on the agenda or were excluded by mistake, so were introduced in this part of the agenda. These are as follows:  1. At the February 2023 meeting of the Parish Council, it was reported that the manhole cover near Chapel House on Main Street had been repaired however this is not the case and it is still loose. However, it is the responsibility of United utilities to repair it.

<b>23/31</b>	<b>Public Participation.</b>	The Chair asked the parishioners present if they wished to make any contributions relating to any items on the agenda, or any other parish-related matter which they may wish to raise. The Parish Council also discussed issues that parishioners had been in contact about.  1. A parishioner has asked if the Parish Council would be able to arrange for the 'Lazonby' signs, the 30mph signs into the village and the reverse side of the 30mph signs to be cleaned as they either have green moss or algae on them and are looking quite tatty. The parishioner has said if they were cleaned it would highlight the

23/32	Report from the local Community Police.	<p><b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that the following written report was received from Erica Norman PCSO 5397 of the local community Police.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Overnight between the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> of January a Land Rover was moved in a yard in North Dykes, believed to be attempted theft.</li> <li>On the 11<sup>th</sup> of February, a driver was arrested for drug driving in Lazonby.</li> <li>Overnight between 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> February a car on Meadow Close was damaged by paint thrown over it and a tyre slashed.</li> <li>At 2:30 am on 23<sup>rd</sup> February, a white flatbed van was seen in Great Salkeld and Lazonby with men going into people's gardens. CCTV enquiries were conducted to try and identify the vehicle however the Police were unable to. There was nothing reported as stolen.</li> <li>At 3 am on 26<sup>th</sup> February, a van pulled up outside a property in Great Salkeld and a male got out and went towards the property but got spooked when the dog started barking.</li> <li>On 25<sup>th</sup> February very pushy males in an Irish-plated vehicle were going door to door asking to pressure wash driveways. 23/34	Progress Reports on Recent Actions.	The Council received progress reports regarding matters from the Minutes of the Council Meeting on the 1 <sup>st</sup> of February 2023.
	a. Donations at Eden Bridge Car Park (Last minute 23/09).	<p>The Council received an update about the donations for Eden Bridge Car Park. Councillor Angie Miller and Treasurer Chris Hoy have provided a feasibility study regarding the provision of a donation facility for users of the Eden Bridge car park based on the information given by other Parish Councils. This study is as follows:</p> <p>1. <b>Cash</b> – This would mean having a built permanent donation box. The method of collecting donations seems popular with Parish Councillors but they have said that the use of cash has <b>decreased</b> since Covid. The Parish Council have said they have had very few</p>

		<p>problems with vandalism.</p> <p>Hesket Market Parish Council have said that they have a metal box made by a company called "Donation Boxes" which looks great (photos are available). This is expensive but the Parish Council <b>across the County</b> also have a QR code on the box to give two methods of payment. The box cost approximately £1000 to install.</p> <p>2. <b>QR codes</b> – Parish Councils are beginning to look into the use of QR codes. Three names were mentioned for setting them up – Ringo, SUMup and Square. Square is operated by a QR code which is linked to their bank account. It looks far easier to set up and after a 2% fee per transaction; it is paid immediately into the Parish Council's account. Once an account has been opened with Square then QR codes can be printed and attached to signage. The other providers have a similar process.</p> <p>3. <b>Text Service</b> – The original investigation was steered towards Just Donate prior to contacting other Parish Councils, subsequently Just Donate has been found to operate a text donation service. The donation will stay in their account until it accumulates to £100 after commission, which is similar to Squares commission. It involves a website mission statement about the Parish Council and a very laborious process in comparison to QR codes through Square, Ringo and SUMup.</p> <p>4. <b>Conclusion:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Donation Boxes are exposed to theft, are possibly costly to set up and will require monitoring before being banked.</li> <li>• QR codes are simplistic with real-time banking, no set up costs just signage costs.</li> <li>• Text Service set-up is onerous and donations are withheld until substantial amounts are accumulated.</li> </ul> <p><b>RESOLVED</b> that the Council wished to pursue the use of a QR code.</p> <p><b>ALSO RESOLVED</b> that Councillor Angie Miller and Treasurer Chris Hoy will continue to look further into which is the best provider of QR codes for the aim of collecting donations for the use of Eden Bridge Car park.</p>
	<b>b. Repair of the door on the Grass Cutting equipment storage shed (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that the Council are still waiting for an invoice for the rendering work on the grass-cutting equipment storage shed so Councillor John Judson will ask for the invoice again.
	<b>c. State of footpaths in the Village (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that the County Council's program for the maintenance of footpaths, including drop kerbs is still ongoing.
	<b>d. Parish Fishing (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that Councillors Peter Foley and Tim Wright, and Treasurer Chris Hoy still need to arrange to have a virtual meeting with the Angling Club representatives which involves finding a date that suits everyone.
	<b>e. Sign at River Eden (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that Councillor Chris West has tried to contact the Office Manager at Lazonby Estates regarding the letter about the 'no access ISSS site on our stream by Lazonby Estates' sign on the gates at the River Eden but she is currently away although it is hoped that she will get in touch on her return.

	<b>f. Broken Rail near the Old School (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that although the broken flagstone still needs to be replaced the Council has agreed to let the Contractor and the people paying for the damage deal with this from now on, so this can be removed from the agenda.
	<b>g. Scaur Close steps (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<p>The Council received an update on the Scaur Close steps after it was reported that a brick has come out from under the steps which go from Scaur Close onto Salkeld road. The damaged steps had been reported to Cumbria Highways who said they had been out to try and fix it but they found that it had already been fixed however this was not the case. Councillor Hilary Carrick sent photos of the steps to Cumbria Highways. They have now said that as far as they are concerned the steps are structurally sound and so they will be leaving them as they are.</p> <p><b>RESOLVED</b> that the report about there being no further action to be taken regarding the Scaur Close steps be noted with thanks to County Councillor Hilary Carrick.</p>
	<b>h. Surface Water on the Road to Plumpton (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that the gulleys have now been cleared and cleaned between Will Pool and the top of the hill, which should solve the issue of surface water on the road from Lazonby to Plumpton,
	<b>i. Mud on Road from Quarry Vehicles and Blocked Gulley (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<p>The Council received an update about mud on road from quarry vehicles and the blocked gulley. So far Cumbria Highways has temporarily repaired a slab over a chamber that was dislodged by a car mounting the verge. It has now been made safe and they are waiting to replace it all with a new cover.</p> <p><b>RESOLVED</b> that the report about the repair to the cover of the chamber by the side of the road has temporarily been repaired.</p>
	<b>j. Damaged Stone Plinth near the Church (Last minute 23/09).</b>	<p><b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that the damaged Stone Plinth near the Church has now been repaired.</p> <p><b>ALSO RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that there was a mix-up with the Council's new computer system that meant the Structures Team received the initial information about the damaged stone plinth and as they felt it was not structurally unsound they considered the issue was completed; however, the issue should have gone to Cumbria Highways, so now having been passed onto them, the issue was resolved with the repair of the stone plinth.</p>
	<b>k. pothole on the road to North Dykes (Last minute 23/06).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that the pothole on the road to North Dykes after the 30 mile an hour sign, near the telephone exchange, has now been repaired as has a pothole near Bracken Bank.
	<b>l. Damage to the Small Bridge-style Wall Over Harrowbeck (Last minute 23/06).</b>	<b>RESOLVED</b> that it be noted that there was no update as yet about the damage to the small bridge-style wall over Harrowbeck and the nearby property.

The Council Budget will be agreed upon next week</li> <li>2. This Parish Council Meeting will be County Councillor Hilary Carrick's last meeting in this role before becoming a Councillor for Westmoreland &amp; Furness Council from April 1<sup>st</sup> 2023.</li> <li>3. Current issues raised in the Parish: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) A parishioner has reported that he has rain running into his garage coming off the road, so Cumbria Highways is looking at redesigning the area.</li> <li>b) A property on Rectory Lane has drainage issues which also affect their garage however Cumbria Highways has said it is not their issue to deal with.</li> <li>c) There have been parking issues near the school where cars are being parked over driveways. CALC has sought clarification from NALC on meeting dates if a Parish Council's election is contested, and below is the response:</p> <p><i>“The earliest date depends on when the results are announced hence our not specifying a date. If the results are announced on Thursday 4th May and a notice/ summons is issued that day then the three clear days are Friday, Saturday and Tuesday so the earliest a meeting can take place is Wednesday 10th May. However, if the result is not declared until Friday 5th May and the notice/summons is issued that day then the earliest date is Thursday 11th May. If the result is not declared until Saturday then the earliest date is Friday 12th May and so on.”</i></p> <p><b>NALC Legal Update – February 2023 - Annual council meetings dates - uncontested elections:</b></p> <p>Further to our annual meeting day guidance in December 2022, we have been asked about the earliest date a council annual meeting can be held where there is no contested election. Our view is that where there is no contested election, so it is known whom to summons, the summons can be</p>

		<p>served in sufficient time with the requisite three clear days' notice so that the annual council meeting could be held on Tuesday 9 May. That is the day councillors will take office because of the Coronation bank holiday on Monday 8 May. Councils have to know who they need to summons so notice cannot be given before results are known where there are contested elections.</p> <p>The Council discussed whether or not to change the Parish Council's date of the Annual General Meeting and the Annual Open Parish Meeting in light of the above information.</p> <p><b>RESOLVED</b> that the information regarding the NALC Legal Update – February 2023 to do with when to hold Parish Council meetings following the May 2023 elections be noted.</p> <p><b>ALSO RESOLVED</b> that the Council agreed to keep the Parish Council's Annual General Meeting and the Annual Open Parish Meeting for Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May 2023 unless it has to be changed due to the election results not being declared until later than hoped.</p>
23/46	Parish Grass-cutting for 2023.	<p>It was recommended to the Council that the parish grass-cutting volunteers should be mobilised again for 2023 with a letter to the volunteers from the Council.</p> <p><b>RESOLVED</b> that the grass cutter's letters be amended to include all volunteers and then given out to the volunteer grass cutters in early April 2023.</p>
23/47	Parish Field and Grazing to Let for 2023.	<p>The Council considered the Parish Field and grazing to let for 2023. It was also recommended that the Council agree to give the Clerk and the Chair delegated authority to open the submitted bids for the grazing after the deadline and make a decision on who will rent the field. The Clerk will then inform the successful bidder of the decision. The Clerk will put up sheep grazing posters on the notice boards and the LPC Website to advertise the parish playing/sports field from 1st April until 30<sup>th</sup> November, with a deadline for sealed bids by Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2023.</p> <p><b>RESOLVED</b> that the Clerk advertises the Parish sports/playing field for sheep grazing from 1st April until 30<sup>th</sup> November, with a deadline for sealed bids by Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2023.</p> <p><b>ALSO RESOLVED</b> that the Council agreed to give the Clerk and the Chair delegated authority to open the submitted bids for the grazing after the deadline and make a decision on who will rent the field, then the Clerk will inform the successful bidder of the decision.</p>
23/48	King's Coronation Celebrations.	<p>The Council considered a grant which has been made available to the Parish Council to apply for if the Parish Council can co-ordinate a fun event to celebrate the Coronation. Councillor Chris West is happy to organise the event with a date for Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May 2023. Several community organizations and the Village School are happy to be part of the event, with the school offering the school field to hold fun games and a barbeque. There will also be several themed decorating cake competitions for all ages, the best crown competition for children, Maypole lessons and tug-of-war. The Church will also hold a special service. The Village Hall will hold a Ceilidh in the evening. Eden Court residents will make celebration bookmarks. Also, the Children will receive a coronation bookmark each. The School and the Parish Council insurance will cover the event. Councillor Chris West will apply for a grant to pay for the Coronation celebrations.</p>

23/51	<b>Invitations to Participate.</b>	<p>The Council considered if Council Members would like to comment, take part in, attend, or send a representative to any invitations to participate.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>1. Rural Cost of Living Household Survey</b> - The Rural Services Network in partnership with Citizens Advice is running a <u>Rural Cost of Living Household Survey</u>. They were thrilled with the 3,000 responses they have had so far but we would like more and are hoping you can help! Ideally, they would like to target hard to reach rural residents, i.e. those without access to the internet or the capacity to engage with services online. They have also ensured the survey can be completed multiple times on the same device, so if colleagues are in the community with a digital device, they could help rural residents complete the survey. Results from the survey will build on the Rural Cost of Living <u>research</u> they commissioned last year and help them to lobby Government Departments, MPs and other policymakers for a fairer deal for rural communities. The survey will run until 31st March 2023.</li> <li><b>2. Finding, Understanding and Using Weather Information Event – 9th March 2023</b> – Alan Goodman from the Met Office will be finding, understanding and using Weather Information. An online training session for Cumbria community groups and voluntary sector organisations with an interest in emergency planning. If you live in Cumbria, it's hard not to be interested in the weather – we certainly get plenty of it, and it can cause a good deal of disruption. This online session with Alan Goodman, Met Office Civil Contingencies Advisor, will cover: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The basics of weather forecasting – what can reasonably be</li> </ul> </li> </ol>



		<p>predicted and what's hard to pin down</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How weather patterns in Cumbria are changing</li> <li>• Where to find the information the Met Office produces for the public</li> <li>• How to access and use Hazard Manager, a more detailed website for emergency responders</li> </ul> <p>The online session (run on Microsoft Teams) will take place on Thursday 9 March 2023, 1900 – 2030. The sessions aimed at:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Community Emergency Planning Groups</li> <li>• Parish Councils with an emergency plan (or thinking of writing one)</li> <li>• Voluntary sector search and rescue organisations</li> <li>• Any other interested voluntary and community sector organisations</li> <li>• Staff who support voluntary and community sector organisations.</li> </ul> <p><b>3. Great British Spring Clean 2023</b> - The Great British Spring Clean 2023 is back, and we'd like to ask for your support for this year's mass action campaign, which takes place from 17 March to 2 April. At Keep Britain Tidy, we believe that every action to protect the environment, no matter how small, makes a difference.
